

We are trying to improve the auction experience for everyone this year, reducing the chaos and making sure that everyone has a chance to bid on all auction items.

Sellers: You will be provided an auction tag for each item/lot that you would like auctioned. (See sample) You will need to fill out the top portion with your name, call, and starting price. There is a section for a description, but you are also welcome to bring one that you have prepared in advance. After your item is auctioned, the winner may not cash out right away so that they can bid on more items. Once the winner has paid for your item, the cashier will cash you out.

Buyers: Before bidding, please note: This is a cash-only event. If you win an item, an auction assistant will bring you a claim ticket for that item. You can cash-out right away, or you can hold onto your ticket while you bid on other items. At any time you can choose to cash out, just bring your claim ticket to an auction assistant (who will be standing at the front of the room) and they will deliver your item to the cashier's table for cashing out.

RARA RAGS OF THE PAST

Ed Gable, K2MP – RARA Club Historian

20 YEARS AGO, NOVEMBER, 1996

Gee, here's a surprise, the announced November meeting these twenty years ago was the annual RaRa Auction with the Dick and Ed show, aka Dick Goslee K2VCZ and Ed Gable K2MP, as your auctioneers. The only difference from today is the time and location that back then was the Henrietta Fire Hall. A full half-page article (whatever that is) was devoted to the Silent Key announcement of RaRa past Vice President, devoted License Class Director and founder of the RaRa Engraving Team, Robert Lauzon K2RL. The Rochester VHF Group stepped up to the plate by initiating a program called the VHF Academy. This group of volunteers, all experts in the field of VHF/UHF and Satellite operations, planned and implemented an awareness program designed to invite newcomers to the world above 50 MHz. At a classroom in the Greece Apollo Middle school, a full day was devoted to VHF Contesting, VHF propagation, OSCAR Satellites, LASER communications and more. Paul Norder KG2EP, writing for the Xerox Amateur Radio Club reported on their latest 2 meter FM Fox Hunt. The club has done (and continues to do so) many of these popular transmitter hunts and some serious contenders show up with multi-element directional yagis, phased arrays and other antennas capable of use while in motion. From the Want Ads you could buy a Collins 30L-1 linear amplifier from Dick, K2SZE, for \$600.00. Marc Ornstein, WB2YYB, roofer and general building contractor, remained a long time commercial advertiser.

- 3.) The seller must come forward to the Treasurer's table as soon as the item is declared SOLD! by the auctioneer.
- 4.) You must be a RaRa member in order to gain admittance to the auction. Our membership chairman, will be happy to accept your renewal on the night of the auction. Each paid up member can bring one guest into the auction.
- 5.) Please, NO PARKING LOT or BACK OF THE ROOM SALES! (No prior sales.) RaRa can only pay the rent if you help us by allowing all the items you brought to be auctioned off to the highest bidder! Continued on page 3

40 YEARS AGO, NOVEMBER, 1976

Gee, here's a surprise, the announced November meeting these 40 years ago was the annual RaRa Auction, only this time held at the Fire Academy Building on Scottsville Road. Plans for the 1977 Rochester Hamfest were announced with a new headquarters and two days at the Fairgrounds. Several changes in call letter assignments were announced by the FCC. The most noteworthy was the issuing of WA2xxx calls to Novices instead of the familiar WN2xxx. Novices were allowed to sign WA2xxx/N at their option. Also new were 1x2 calls with the suffix beginning X, thus giving 52 new Extra Class call letters in each district. Finally, 1x2 calls beginning with the letter N were issued for the first time in November. At the same time as the call letter changes a welcome announcement brought the end of the requirement to sign mobile and portable operation. RaRa Treasurer Len Gessin, WA2ZNC, wrote an informative article detailing RaRa's spending and budget. At this time it was reported that RaRa membership stood at 750. Ed Valmore, K2EVJ, wrote to tell us that Mike Baker, K2LZF, will be the next Speaker at the Rochester VHF Club meeting with the topic antenna support for large arrays. No longer a potential advertiser was Trigger Electronics which was cited by the Illinois Attorney General for consumer fraud. From the Want Ads you could buy a nice selection of Heath gear from John Schooley, W2BLU. Allied Radio and TV, Wally Kincaid, WB2HZG President, remained a long time commercial advertiser.

Annual RaRa Auction Featured at the November 5th Meeting

Once again it's auction time at RaRa. This ever popular event will begin at 8 p.m. on Friday, November 5th. The normal meeting hall will not be used due to space limitations. Instead, the auction will take place at the Monroe County Fire Academy at 1200 Scottsville Road, just to the left of the Rochester Drive-In Theater. All parking and the entrance to the building is in the rear.

As in previous years, the auction is limited to RaRa members and one guest. Members will have to show their membership card to enter. Guests must register at the door.

As you know from reports here in the Rag and at meetings, there is a very large group of new associates members attending our licensing classes. At this time these people are looking for all kinds of basic equipment to begin their Ham careers with. Therefore, everyone is urged to purge their cellars and attics of unused gear to help our new members along. At the same time, however, don't bring pure junk! Let's face it, this is the solid-state age. Boxes full of 6SN7's and the like just aren't worth fooling around with.

The usual ten percent sellers fee will be continued and all gear displayed must go through the auction block - no prior sales.

The good people from K2JD Engraving will be present to take badge orders and other commercial exhibitors are encouraged.

If all goes according to plan (the order comes in) some members of the Board will be sporting the new official RaRa jackets. If there is enough interest shown these jackets will be made available to members at a nominal cost.

Come early to browse through the gear, the bidding starts at eight p. m. See ya there.

Novice "N" Disappearing

The FCC has begun to issue regular WA and WB calls to novices who already hold a "WN" call. The action will make life a little easier and a little more difficult at the same time for novices. Easier, for it will not be necessary to replace QSL cards, name badges, etc., when upgrading to general or a higher class. More difficult because of the not-distinctive call.

Novices may, at their option, use slantbar-N after their call to identify themselves, example - WA2XXX/N. Other operators should extend every courtesy to operators signing slantbar-N.

The issue of the WA and WB calls to novices is automatic to those already holding WN calls. All new novices will automatically receive a WA or WB call. In some areas of the country, WD calls are beginning to appear.

The license itself now comes in a new computer generated tear-out form, just like some billing, tax statements and the like are currently generated. The new license is not as fancy as those in the past... but it's privileges are what counts, not the paper used for printing.

TWO LETTER CALLS

The FCC has announced that effective November 2, two-letter calls with "X" as the first letter of the suffix will be available for assignment. This provides 52 additional two-letter calls for each call area. Also effective November 2, the "N" prefix block will be available to applicants for two-letter calls.

DUES . . .

Membership chairman, Otto Bluntzer, WB2RJB, has sent due bills to the few RaRa members who have not yet paid their annual dues.

If, by chance, you have already paid your dues and received a bill, please tell us. Such a situation can occur for two reasons. First, your check and the bill could pass in the mails. Second, believe it or not, we can make an error.

You can save time and postage by seeing Otto and his committee at the November meeting.

Those who have already paid their 1976-77 dues need not read this item any further.


Rochester Hamfest May 20-22


